Program Year 1 Action Plan General Questions response:

Geographic Distribution: The City of Long Branch is located in eastern Monmouth County and is the largest urban area in the county. Long Branch has a population of nearly 32,000 people and has a poverty rate of 11%. Long Branch has nearly 5 miles of oceanfront property and the total square miles is 5.10. Long Branch is one of Monmouth County's fastest growing cities and is presently undergoing several major redevelopment projects.

Certain proposed activities will be site-specific; other activities will be implemented on a City-wide basis or serve low-income block groups. The geographic distribution of FY 2005 CDBG funds is noted on each sheet in the Project Workbook.

The City of Long Branch's Office of Community and Economic Development (OCED) has prepared the 2005 Action Plan in accordance with Section 91.220 of HUD regulations and after conducting community outreach and public hearings to obtain inputs from citizens and organizations serving the jurisdiction.

Program Year 1 Action Plan Citizen Participation response:

Public forums are held monthly usually in the evenings to accommodate working adults. Agencies, churches, organizations, individuals, non-profits and others are sent a mailing to solicit their attendance to all of the publicized meetings. The current program year is discussed as a means of interim evaluations and proposals are discussed for the forthcoming Program Year.

Citizens were willing to discuss the plan and generally commented that resources were being used as were projected. Questions were raised about re-surfacing streets and water drainage (streets flood in heavy rains). Both of these concerns were handled by the Public Works Department.

Citizens also expressed concerns about ongoing redevelopment projects, relocations and other redevelopment zones. These concerns were properly addressed and relocation statutes were made available to all concerned parties.

Discussions of parks development projects and new affordable housing took place. Many people are interested in being added to a list approved by the NJ State Department of Community Affairs Affordable Housing Management Services.

Efforts to reach other groups are standard as personal visits to various organizations such as the Portuguese Club, Hispanic Club, MOCEANS office, Brazillian Club, Mexican Club and others are routinely done by the Program Director. In addition, mailings of all registered businesses are invited to every held meeting.

There were no comments not accepted.

Institutional Structure

Program Year 1 Action Plan Institutional Structure response:

The OCED of the City of Long Branch is the lead agency for implementation of the housing and community development plan as well as the administration of the CDBG, RCA, UEZ, NJ Green Acres Program and Relocations done in the City. The OCED plans and implements specific CDBG programs in addition to entering into subgrantee agreements with non-profit agencies and social service providers. The OCED also works in collaboration with all City Departments and legal professionals to deliver services and other benefits to those eligible clients. The OCED works with other special needs groups and special problems that transpire within the City. The OCED is the lead agency regarding economic development and business revitalization. The OCED works with all organizations, banks, businesses, schools, colleges, church groups, hospitals, medical centers, property owners and others so long as the need surfaces and is eligible under HUD regulations.

The Long Branch Housing Authority plays a major role in providing affordable housinh rental units to extremely low-income and low-income City residents. The OCED and PHA collaborate on many projects.

The OCED and PHA coordinate in the planning process and the allocation of resources to address the housing needs and community needs of very low and low-income residents. There is an excellent working relationship between the Executive Director of the housing authority and the Director of trhe OCED. There is constant communication and information sharing. Much of the information regarding the PHA was in fact provided by the staff of the Long Branch Housing Authority.

Monitoring

Program Year 1 Action Plan Monitoring response:

Federal regulations stipulate that CDBG Entitlement grantees must monitor subrecipients and relevant allocations in order to ensure federal compliance expenditure of program funds. National Objectives must be met and equal and fair opportunities must be affirmatively utilized for and procurement of federal projects. The Office of Community and Economic Development closely monitors all subrecipients and/or agencies receiving financial assistance, and the OCED staff regularly visits sites and projects that are ongoing. Any and all reports that are done during a visit are communicated subrecipient and written reports are made available as well.

The OCED will be responsible for enforcing and monitoring procedures relevant expenditure of federal funds for low and moderate income residents to ensure that needed housing assistance and supportive services are available, the use of all funds is consistent with the priority needs tables printed in the Consolidated Plan, recipients are in compliance with applicable regulations regarding the disbursement of federal funds, record keeping and financial management systems are provided to maintain documentation on program compliance and disbursement of federal funds in accordance with applicable laws, and that the information submitted to HUD is correct and complete.

The City has a system of internal financial controls for the administration of the CDBG program. Annual audits are performed in compliance with the Federal Single Audit Act and with State budgetary law.

The OCED regularly monitors the quality and quantity of services delivered by subrecipients. The OCED has established subrecipient reporting formats to ensure accountability and compliance with HUD regulations. The OCED is also responsible for monitoring the timeliness of funded projects and expenditures.

Lead-based Paint

Program Year 1 Action Plan Lead-based Paint response:

The OCED has enacted a strategy with the City's Health Department to address lead-based paint concerns. In the past year there were three reported EBLs and all were promptly handled by the OCED and Health Department.

The City is implementing a proactive service that will conduct wipe tests in older homes where young children are present and construction is required. This approach will identify lead-based paint presence prior to starting any repairs or renovations. In addition, the OCED distributes lead-based paint information flyers and brochures to all applicants of home repair assistance.

Program Year 1 Action Plan Specific Objectives response:
Special Needs Housing:

Homelessness and family displacement numbers are on the rise. The shortage of affordable housing, affordable rental units and temporary housing was made more evident as more and more people are calling on the local Office of Community and Economic Development for housing assistance. The Office of Community and Economic Development (OCED) offers assistance for Special Needs cases. Under normal circumstances local clients are referred to the County of Monmouth Continuum of Care. However, in the event there is an emergent need, the OCED is prepared to offer assistance. Emergency temporary housing is provided as well as relocations when deemed necessary by the Department of Health, Police or Code Enforcement. Demand has increased and expectations are that allocated funds will be used to help those in need.

Weatherization / Special Housing Assistance

In the event a low to moderate-income household experiences a hardship or if an event occurs that creates a hardship for such a family in need, and no other assistance exists, the OCED offers aid to help restore normalcy. Should a major system such as roof damage, trouble with the heating system or furnace during extreme weather conditions or any other uncontrollable act occur, the OCED can provide help to the household and individuals who require assistance.

Rehabilitation Administration

The OCED is the lead agency in the City to offer housing rehabilitation funds to abate code violations in very low to moderate-income households. Regional Contribution Agreement (RCA) funds, RCA repayment funds and some local funds are used for this purpose. OCED staff administers all housing restoration programs and CDBG funds are requested to help with the administration of the OCED housing programs. New Regional Contribution Agreements are in the works and the City of Long Branch will continue to administer its own with funds that are repaid to the OCED when an assisted family chooses to sell the property or refinance the same.

Code Enforcement

The City of Long Branch places high priority on Code Enforcement and property improvement. The OCED supports this effort as strategies to eradicate blight and sub-standard housing units have been implemented by the Building, Code Enforcement and Community Development departments. Whenever an individual or family moves out of an apartment unit, the landlord is mandated to put the City on notice so that an inspection can be made of the unit. In addition; a collaborative endeavor has been put in operation to monitor the issuance of Certificates of Occupancy in low and moderate-income zones. Units must be thoroughly inspected and approved before Certificates are issued. The OCED supports the administration of Code Enforcement as these initiatives have proven to work well in reducing blight and poverty conditions as well as improving underutilized business zones. In the past Program Year, over 1200 inspections were done in low to moderate areas that prompted the issuance of over 1200 Certificates of Occupancy.

First-Time Homebuyer Program

The First-Time Homebuyer Project has been taken over by the County of Monmouth as a result of the City of Long Branch joining the Monmouth County Consortium (along with Asbury Park and Middletown). The program offers up to \$10,000 to defray closing costs or for down payment assistance toward the purchase of a home. The OCED maintains a small allocation to assist first-time buyers when smaller amounts are needed to complete purchase transactions. Grants ranging from \$1,500 to \$3,000 are available to offset down payment and closing costs.

Demolitions

Improving neighborhoods and communities is a vital part of community growth and stability. Abandoned and dangerous buildings are razed and liens are attached to any property that is cleared with the use of federal funds. Eventually the City will foreclose on such properties and the titles will be taken. City-owned lots are used to produce new affordable housing units. To date, some thirty-eight new units have been built and more construction of affordable units is planned as forty-eight market-rate assisted units are under construction. The City plans to build an additional 400 units of affordable homes, rental and dormitory-type units in the Broadway Redevelopment Zone area.

Program Year 1 Action Plan Community Development response:
Specific details for each project are contained in the Year 1 Action Plan Projects Workbook.

Project #2 - Community Facility Improvements

Public and community properties that serve low to moderate income families are systematically upgraded to efficiently handle demands and use. The public library is being rehabilitated and estimates came in at 1.5 million dollars. Other facilities that are slated for upgrades during the 2005 Program Year include the Senior Center, Bucky James Community Center, and the Atlantic Firehouse and Park.

Project #3 - Conrail Property Improvement/Community Gardens

The Conrail site is in a low/mod zone and is used for open space, community gardens, flower gardens, a picnic area and other activities. The right-of-way was previously a high-crime area, used as an escape route for criminals after committing crimes in low/mod areas. Each year improvements are made to upgrade this area. This year we will plant four vegetable gardens with a goal of feeding 80 people . We will also provide training classes for 30 people in horticulture skills.

Project #4 - Community Health Center

The past program year it was hoped that a community health facility would be supported by the OCED. Plans to go forward with this project were delayed, however, as other leveraged funds were slow to be secured.

Project #5 - Community Assistance/Aid to Non-Profits

Various non-profit groups and individuals request assistance for worthy causes during the program year. The OCED provides aid to non-profits for cultural, educational, recreational, social economic and other causes on an as-needed as-requested basis.

Project #6 - Debt Service, Public Library

The OCED supports the debt service related to the improvements being made at the Main Branch of the Long Branch Free Public Library.

Project #7 - Crime Prevention/Community Policing

Community Policing has been extremely effective and the result of supporting this project has been reduced crime in the city. In recent years the crime rate has been reduced by double-digit numbers.

Project #9 - Economic Development/Technical Assistance

Financial assistance to support the salary for duties relevant to business retention and job creation in low/mod business areas. The Assistant Director of Industrial Development is responsible for servicing low/mod businesses, recording available space, contacting merchants and businesses interested in relocating, keeping records of job availability, holding business seminars and reporting employment retention and opportunities. Technical assistance is provided to all businesses in low/mod zones and job retention and job creation statistics are periodically updated.

Project # 12 - Parks Improvement/Development

OCED has become the responsible entity for aggressively initiating City-owned parks and recreation sites that serve low to moderate income households. The OCED applied for and received supplementary funding from the NJ State Green Acres Program to improve open space areas.

Project #13 - Planning and Administration

Program administration, office equipment, furniture and materials, vehicle operations, memberships, conferences and related expenses, office rent, phone and pager service, office supplies, photo copies, film development, equipment repair and service and other expenses are categories essential in carrying out objectives established by the CDBG Program.

Project #14 - Redevelopment Project

The OCED continues to be the lead agency in supporting redevelopment projects in underutilized zones. Currently two sectors, Beachfront North and Pier Village are already being redeveloped and are nearing completion. In addition, the Broadway business corridor was declared an area in need of redevelopment in early 2003. This designation will give the city the tools it needs to go forward with development and new construction projects specifically for this underutilized business zone.

Project #15 - Senior Center Upgrades

A key component to providing comprehensive assistance to low/mod residents is to offer relief to senior citizens. Funds from this project will be used to upgrade the Senior Center.

Project #16 - Senior Activities

A key component to providing comprehensive assistance to low/mod residents is to offer relief to senior citizens. Each year aid is directed to the seniors in the form of social, recreational, educational, cultural and economic programs. A full-time director works in conjunction with OCED to express needs and concerns of the elderly. Regular meetings are held as the Director of OCED serves on the Senior Center Advisory Committee.

Project #17 - Sidewalk Repair and Parking Lot Improvements

Commercial sidewalks in many of the distressed zones will be addressed. City-owned parking lots that provide locations for customer to park while they shop are also in dire need of repair. Project Facelift is an ongoing project started by the OCED that addresses restoration of sidewalks and parking facilities. Areas in lower Broadway, upper Broadway, West End and Mid-Town, all HUD zones, will be improved with resurfacing, re-striping, new lighting, pavers, medians, curbing, landscaping and other amenities. Other funds outside the CDBG will be leveraged to complete these actions.

Project #18 - Special Needs Housing /Displacement Assistance

The OCED offers assistance for Special Needs cases. Under normal circumstances local clients are referred to the Monmouth County Continuum of Care program. However, in the event there is an emergent need, the OCED is prepared to offer assistance.

Project #20 - Youth Center

Intrinsic in any community planning is providing choices for the youth of the community. The OCED acts as a liaison between public schools, the City Recreation Department, various organizations, the local housing authority and area youth to collaborate on various programs, projects and services to be provided to young girls and boys. The OCED specifically offers assistance to Bucky James Center on behalf of youth programs, supports non-profits that provide cultural, educational, recreational and social events, and purchases recreational equipment and tools to complement other activities that are coordinated between agencies, schools and other organizations. Funds will be used to directly upgrade the Long Branch Community Center.

Project #21 - Youth Center Activities

OCED and CDBG funds will be used to provide assistance to youth groups for activities, trips, events, education and social purposes. 2004 will see various youth groups and organizations such as LB Recreation, LBPHA, Pop Warner Football, Biddy Basketball and others receive assistance.

Project #22 - Job Training

The Long Branch Housing Authority conducts a Certified Home Health Aide Training to provide job skills for LBPHA residents. In addition, assistance is provided to Purpose At Heart for job training.

Project #23 - Recreational Center
